



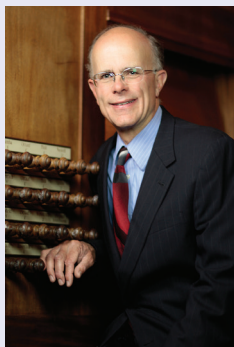

International Laureate's Organ Series Todd Wilson

Regarded across America and around the world as one of today's finest concert organists, Todd Wilson is head of the Organ Department at The Cleveland Institute of Music, and is also Director of Music at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Cleveland, Ohio and Curator of the E.M. Skinner pipe organ at Severance Hall (home of The Cleveland Orchestra). His program will include the music of Charles-Marie Widor (1844-1937), Gerre Hancock (1934-2012), Jean-Baptiste Robin (b. 1976), George Shearing (1919-2011) and the monumental "Sonata on the 94th Psalm" by Julius Reubke (1834-1858). Statement from Bishop Taylor

Bishop Diocesan John Harvey Taylor has offered the following statement and prayer in response to Wednesday night's Borderline shooting that killed 12 and injured others in Thousand Oaks, a Ventura County city within the Diocese of Los Angeles.

"The Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles joins in mourning the victims of the Borderline shooting in Thousand Oaks and offering words of comfort and support to their families and those who were wounded. This act of anger, hatred, and violence reminds us of Jesus Christ's invitation to his realm of forgiveness, love, and peace. We make our way there together by merciful acts of prayer and consolation and then resolute acts of justice and mercy: Advocating along with Bishops United Against Gun Violence for common-sense reforms; supporting organizations pledged to serve veterans of Afghanistan and Iraq who are battling trauma and the effects of moral hazard; and working to erase the stain of social isolation by making our churches and other faith institutions places of connection and care for all people."
