




## Welcome to St. James' in the City!

## **Notice of Upcoming Vestry Election at Annual Parish Meeting** **SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 10<sup>th</sup> After the 10:30 Service**

In the Episcopal Church the vestry, a group of lay persons acting in concert with the rector, functions in a manner analogous to a board of trustees or director of a corporation: most significantly, the vestry is charged with fiduciary responsibilities for church property, as well as with calling and periodically evaluating the rector. St. James' bylaws call for three year terms for vestry members, so each year a new "class" of vestry members must be chosen.

In accordance with the parish bylaws your vestry appointed a nominating committee composed of vestry and non-vestry members (Stephen Yeazell, Emily Abbott, José Zambrana, Adoabi Obijaku, and Sandra Lee). That committee in turn presented a slate of proposed nominees to the vestry, which unanimously approved the slate at its December meeting. The short biographies and pictures of this slate appear below. At our annual meeting (on February 10, after the 10:30 am service) this slate (and any additional nominees) will be submitted to the annual meeting for a vote by qualified parishioners. If approved, each new member of the vestry will have a three year term, again according to our bylaws. If members of the parish wish to nominate themselves or a fellow parishioner as alternates to the vestry slate, they must do so by submitting the names in writing to the parish office no later than January 25<sup>th</sup>. The office will circulate the bios of any additional nominees. Further in accordance with our bylaws, we will post a list of those entitled to vote at the annual meeting in the parish hall starting this Sunday. #### **Stephen Bedikian**

My wife Heather and I joined St. James' in 2004 when our son Jordan was baptized in the Church. Jordan subsequently attended St. James Episcopal School and graduated in 2012. I attended an Episcopal high school and UCLA, where I met my husband, Alan.

Alan and I attended St. Luke's of the Mountains which was close to our home in La Crescenta, and later St. Mark's in Glendale, where we later moved. I was active in both parishes (a member of The Daughters of the King, a prayer and service group) and served on search committees and on vestries.
