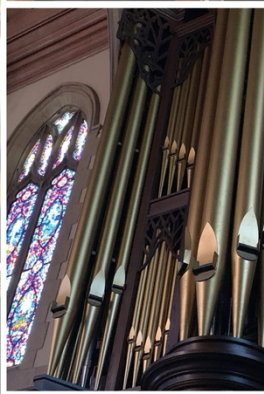

About the artists . . .

The **Colburn School** provides the highest quality performing arts education at all levels of development in an optimal learning environment. With a drive for access to excellence, students in our Community School, Music Academy, Trudl Zipper Dance Institute, and Conservatory of Music receive training, guidance, and comprehensive educational experiences from our renowned faculty located in the arts district of downtown Los Angeles. The Colburn Community School offers online and in-person music lessons on many instruments — piano, strings, woodwinds, brass, percussion, and voice, with all experience levels welcome, from beginner to advanced.

The **Colburn Youth Orchestra** (from which we hear their string section) is the premiere orchestral ensemble of the Colburn Community School of Performing Arts. This distinguished ensemble is dedicated to performing a diverse repertoire that spans from standard and contemporary symphonic literature to newly commissioned works and unique arrangements created specifically for the orchestra. Its dynamic programming is designed to challenge and inspire its young musicians, highlight the technical skill and artistic maturity of the ensemble, and contribute to the evolution of orchestral music.

Eleanor Núñez is a Spanish-American conductor, pianist, and educator currently based in Southern California. She made her international debut in August 2022 with the Orquesta Sinfónica de la Ciudad de Asunción, in Paraguay, where she conducted Chopin’s Piano Concerto No. 2 with soloist Chiara D’Odorico, as well as the debut of Symphony No. 1, by Daniel Luzko. Eleanor programs unique concerts that bridge the gap between the audience and musicians on stage. Her belief that music should be accessible to all shines through her creative repertoire programming, enthusiastic rehearsals, and inviting concert environment. Ms. Núñez loves exploring “the classics” and pairing them with new, modern works. She enjoys working with musical groups of all disciplines and genres, and her conducting experience spans orchestral, wind ensemble, and choral repertoires. She graduated from California State University Fullerton with a Master of Music in Instrumental Conducting and a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance.
